

Strategies for Avoiding a Violation

1. Ask questions! Talk to your professor or college Honor Council Representative.
2. Use resources! Check citation guides (e.g. Chicago Manual of Style, MLA, APA etc.)
3. Read the Honor Code policy!
4. Don't rush or get flustered! Take the worse grade or talk to the professor to see about an extension, if it's possible.
5. Even if ideas are used but not 'paraphrased' from an author, they must still be attributed.
6. Facts and ideas not considered "common knowledge" must be cited explicitly.
